

M1 route to the ICC, The Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA) and Symphony Hall

Exit the M1 at Junction 19 and feed onto the M6.

Stay on the M6 until Junction 6.

Take the A38(M) towards Birmingham City Centre (this is also known as the Aston Expressway).

Continue until the end of the expressway and onto the flyover. The Fire Station and Aston University are on the left.

At the end of the flyover there is a sequence of three tunnels, but it is important that you take the FIRST tunnel only.

Once through the first tunnel, indicate off to the left and continue along Great Charles Street.

This will lead on to Paradise Circus island where you will be forced around to the left.

Get in the right hand lane and continue around the island, ignoring the first three exits and pass under the bridge. At this point, filter into the left lane and take the next turning on the left onto Cambridge Street. Baskerville House is on one corner and a multi-storey car park on the other.

You will then drive past the back of the Library of Birmingham and the Repertory Theatre, coming to a traffic island where you will see the ICC on your left.

Go straight over the island and continue along this road, past the 'Prince of Wales' public house until you arrive at the NIA.

Parking for both buildings is at the Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA). There are three car parks (South Upper, South Lower and North) operating under the pay and display system and providing 2300 spaces.

The entrance to the North Car Park is on the left just after the bridge over the canal.

For the South Lower Car Park turn left at the island and the entrance is left at the traffic lights.

This road turns sharply left and the South Upper Car Park is situated to the left at the next set of traffic lights.

The charges are as follows: Up to 2 hours £2.30 Up to 3 hours £3.50 Up to 8 hours £6.80 8 - 24 hours £8.00
