

## **M42 route to the ICC, The Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA) and Symphony Hall**

Exit M42 at Junction 6 and take the A45 heading for Birmingham City Centre.

This dual carriageway is approximately 10 miles long and the ICC and the Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA) are sign posted all the way. Please bear in mind that the route for these venues and Birmingham City Centre are not always the same.

You will pass the the NEC and Birmingham International Airport on your right.  
After approximately 6 miles you will come to a large island called Bordersley Circus. Follow the signposts for the the ICC and The Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA) to the left along Sandy Lane.

Go straight on at the next island and you will then come to another island where you need to turn right. This is Belgrave Road and the Birmingham Mosque is on the right hand side.

Continue straight on through the underpass which brings you into Lee Bank Middleway.

After the traffic lights move into the right hand lane and turn right (4th exit) at the Five Ways island.

This will take you onto Broad Street.

At the first set of traffic lights (after the pedestrian lights) turn left.

The Novotel is on the opposite corner.

You are now in Sheepcote Street. Continue straight on at the island.

Parking for both buildings is at the Barclaycard Arena (formerly the NIA). There are 3 car parks (South Upper, South Lower and North) operating under a pay and display system and providing 2300 spaces.

The entrance to the South Upper Car Park is in Sheepcote Street on your right after Symphony Court.

Follow the road round to the right and the entrance to the South Lower Car Park is at the next set of traffic lights.

For the North Car Park, continue past the South Lower and turn right at the next island.

This is King Edward's Road and the entrance to the North Car Park is on the right.

The charges are as follows: Up to 2 hours £2.30

Up to 3 hours £3.50

Up to 8 hours £6.80

8 - 24 hours £8.00

(Please note that Symphony Hall is inside the ICC).
