WHAT IS HAPPENING?

The next phase of the Paradise Infrastructure Works will see the introduction of the final rerouted traffic system around the development.

A number of overnight closures of Great Charles Street in October and November will permit preparatory works for the closure of the section of the Paradise Circus one way traffic loop from the end of Great Charles Street past Town Hall to Paradise Street. This will result in a new road layout and an enhanced pedestrian setting for the Town Hall.

Following the closure of the Paradise Circus one way traffic loop (next to the Town Hall), the next phase of demolition will begin which will see the external demolition of the existing library building.

WHEN IS IT HAPPENING?

The Great Charles Street overnight closures scheduled below will run from 22.00hrs to 04.00hrs. To establish necessary diversion routes, some highway restrictions will be necessary from 20.00hrs.

OCTOBER

Sunday 18th October to Wednesday 21st October

Overnight closure of Great Charles Street southbound (into city) between Newhall Street and Paradise Street.

Access to Great Charles Street from Margaret Street will also be closed.

Sunday 25th October to Wednesday 28th October

Overnight closure of Great Charles Street northbound (out of city) between Cambridge Street and Newhall Street.

NOVEMBER

Sunday 1st November to Wednesday 4th November

Contingency dates for potential northbound **OR** southbound closure.

PARADISE CIRCUS ONE WAY TRAFFIC LOOP CLOSURE




The following works will take place to permanently reroute traffic onto the new road layout:


- Full closure of the Paradise Circus one way traffic loop arm between Great Charles Street and Paradise Street running next to the Town Hall
- Overnight closure of Great Charles Street northbound (out of city) between Cambridge Street and Newhall Street
- Overnight Closure of Margaret Street between Edmund Street and Great Charles Street


To establish necessary diversion routes, some highway restrictions will be necessary from 23:45hrs on Saturday 14th November

THE FOLLOWING EXISTING CLOSURES/RESTRICTIONS WILL REMAIN IN PLACE

Sand Pits/Parade

- To remain closed until Spring 2016.
- Closed to ALL inbound and outbound traffic.

Broad Street

- Into city traffic restrictions remain until Autumn 2016.
- Vehicle access on Broad Street restricted from Bridge Street to buses and Hackney Carriages for into city traffic only.

Great Charles Street

Single lane running to remain in place until Summer 2016 which includes:

- Great Charles Street northbound (out of city) from Suffolk Street Queensway/Severn Street to Newhall Street.
- Great Charles Street southbound (into city) from Newhall
 Street to Paradise Street.

Summer Row

- Closed to all vehicles between Lionel Street and Great Charles Street.
- Summer Row works continue with temporary restrictions between Lionel Street and Fleet Street.

Charlotte Street traffic flow reversal

- To remain in place until Spring 2016.
- Access to Charlotte Street is from Newhall Street only.

Bus Diversions

Routes 82, 83, 87, 89, 10H and 126 to remain in place.

Investment in transport improvements is an essential part of Birmingham's future growth and prosperity.

The redevelopment of Paradise will not only generate thousands of new jobs but will also help to improve access across the city for both road users and pedestrians.

Paradise will deliver:

- New road layouts to ease traffic flow.
- Wide, level pedestrian routes making it easier and safer to move between the Jewellery Quarter, Broad Street, Colmore Business District and the city centre.

In addition, Paradise will support proposals to extend the Metro tram network to Centenary Square and to develop the first Birmingham Sprint bus route between the city centre and Quinton.



MOVING OUR CITY FORWARD

Paradise is part of a city-wide programme to transform the way people and goods move across the city.

Through the long-term Birmingham Connected strategy for transport, the city will benefit from an unprecedented level of investment.

In addition to Paradise, work programmes being delivered in 2015 include essential repairs around Junction 6 of the M6 (Spaghetti Junction/Gravelly Hill) and lay-out changes to improve traffic flow at several important junctions on the ring road.

The scale of the improvement programme will place pressure on Birmingham's road network.

The first advice is to use public transport, walk or cycle whenever possible.

Alternatives include car sharing with friends and colleagues or avoiding peak morning and evening periods by staggered work times.

If you do need to use your car, avoid the Paradise area if possible by choosing alternative routes. If you need to drive and cannot avoid the Paradise area, please allow more time for your journey.
