This work has teeth!

Steering group formed around two years ago

Dominated by community equipment representation

Not met for past 9 months

Working groups formed alongside

 Members felt their representations were not taken into account

Rapidly disbanded

Proposals - assessment

 Assessment for 'basic' needs undertaken by assessor (training and regulation unclear)

 Assessment for more complex needs undertaken by health and social services

 Big grey area distinguishing between 'basic' and 'complex'

Proposals - provision

- Provision of 'basic' equipment passed to retail outlets via prescription
 - Increase consumer choice (top up)
 - Promote product development

· Client seen as a consumer

 Possibility of 'low' cost items no longer being funded

Current position

- Community equipment:
 - Business case developed and approved by health Minister (Ivan Lewis, MP)
 - Trials being undertaken in the north west of England
 - Mixed reports of outcomes but heralded as a success (measures unclear)
 - 'consumers' like the model
 - financial savings

Current position

Wheelchairs:

- Less developed than community equipment
- Initial data gathered by around ¼ of wheelchair services considered not to reflect reality
- Further, more extensive, data collection exercise undertaken and now concluded

Current position

- Wheelchairs (cont):
 - Steering group not been consulted since data collection commenced (July 07)
 - Two models developed but neither outline nor detail are known
 - Business case for the two models with the Minister
 - Outcome pending
