



Clinical Issues in Stroke Care

Accreditation: 20 credits at level M or as CPD

A 25 hour multidisciplinary course taught over 3 days in Nursing & Health Care, University of Glasgow and supported using the Moodle e-learning environment.

Dates: 24th - 25th February & 24th March 2014

Rationale

This course aims to prepare the practitioner to gain a deeper understanding of the current clinical issues in stroke care and explore their impact.

Intended Learning Outcomes

The ability to:

1. Critically appraise the impact of stroke illness on the individual, their family and wider community
2. Demonstrate an in-depth understanding of the pathophysiological processes and associated signs and symptoms of stroke disease
3. Critically evaluate multidisciplinary team working in the context of stroke care
4. Critically evaluate the impact of clinical and technical advances on contemporary stroke care
5. Critically appraise the effectiveness of current stroke care and identify areas for future development and research.

Assessment

Summative assessment: A written assignment to be submitted in week 13

Formative assessment: A short PowerPoint presentation to group in week 5

Applicants

Anyone with a relevant professional qualification may apply. The course is open to nurses, doctors, allied health professions and clergy. You should provide names of two referees, preferably the name of one academic referee (or accredited CPD referee) and an employer referee. Overseas and EU students without English as a first language will have documentary evidence of a TOEFL score (570), IELTS score (6.5) or equivalent.
