STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Legal Status

The Posture and Mobility Group is a registered charity, number 1098297. It is governed by its constitution adopted on 21 March 2001 and amended on 16 April 2002, 19 March 2003 and 12 July 2013. It was registered with the Charity Commission as a charity on 2 July 2003.

The Posture and Mobility Group is also a registered charity in Scotland, number SCO44218. It was registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) as a charity on 23 August 2013.

Organisational structure

The day to day management of the charity is carried out by the appointed Secretary. The trustees in liaison with the main committee determine the general policy of the charity and make the major decisions.

Risk management

The trustees are aware that in order for the charity to comply with SORP 2005 a review of the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the charity faces needs to be reviewed and addressed. This is reviewed by the Finance Subcommittee and the elected main committee.

Appointment of trustees

Vested in continuing trustees. There is a requirement of a minimum of three trustees. These are the Chair, Vice-chair, and Treasurer.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

To advance the education of the public in all matters relating to the posture and mobility needs of people with disabilities and about the equipment and services those needs require within a framework which recognises the rights and dignity of such people, through all or any of the following means:

- (i) developing an interdisciplinary forum for continuing education, research and debate in the interests of the general public and of people with disabilities in particular.
- (ii) providing an umbrella organisation linking members of voluntary and statutory agencies, representatives of users' bodies and representatives of manufacturers.
- (iii) maintaining a register of members to enable efficient communication.
- (iv) encouraging the establishment and maintenance of high standards of service delivery.

In the exercise of our powers to that end we have paid due regard to the published guidance from the Charity Commission on the operation of the Public Benefit requirement under the Charities Act 2006.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The 2013 National Training Event achieved its highest ever surplus, and will help progress the group's aims and objectives. Three one-day workshops by Mary Massery were hosted in London, Edinburgh and Manchester.

Reserves continued to be made available to support the in-house journal and the research fund, with two new research study proposals approved for funding during the year, and one more study reaching completion. In addition, £15,000 was earmarked to commission a scoping exercise on service user views during 2014: Jo Goodship of Admiralty Consultants was offered and accepted the commission.

Funds were approved to employ an Events & Marketing Co-ordinator on a full-time basis, and the post advertised for one year.

PMG successfully registered as a Charitable Organisation in Scotland to reflect the work done there. Number: SC044218

Approval was given by the Trustees to change PMG from a Charitable Organisation to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The National Training Event will take place at Motorpoint Arena in Cardiff in July 2014.

A new Events & Marketing co-ordinator will be employed on a one year full time contract. In order to house 2 members of staff, PMG will seek reasonably priced office accommodation to rent in Exeter.

PMG, led by the Education & Training sub-committee, will work in collaboration with the National Wheelchair Managers Forum (NWMF) on scoping relevant provision of training for members and others, based on the recently published NWMF competencies.

More Best Practice Guidelines will be published.

The Research Fund and in-house journal will continue to be supported, with plans to change the journal to a more widely accessible online format. Jo Goodship's findings from the commissioned scoping exercise on service user views will be published.

Consideration will be given to removing PMG's membership fees. This will cut down substantially on staff and volunteer resources, help grow the membership by reaching out to many more, and help retain current members. It will also mean that future development of the PMG website will be substantially cheaper, without the requirement for a costly online payment system.

A specification to develop the PMG website will be produced.

PMG trustees will seek approval from the membership for the change of status to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

PMG will apply for registration as a Charitable Organisation in Northern Ireland.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources are accounted for on a receivable basis.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in furtherance of the charity's objectives and represents the cost of goods and services and ancillary trading costs that have been incurred in charitable activities. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirement of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

The Research and Development Fund was set up in 2005 to support relevant research and development. Since the project was set up the group have approved research projects totalling £88,174 of which researchers have claimed £63,983. The trustees have taken the decision to take the value of authorised grants to the SOFA each year rather than the actual amount paid out, and any unpaid grants are recorded as a creditor.

As at the balance sheet date the research and development fund had uncommitted funds of £5,326 (2012: £22,572).
