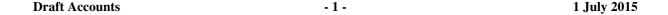

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Legal Status

The Posture and Mobility Group ("PMG") is a registered charity, number 1098297. It is governed by its constitution adopted on 21 March 2001 and amended on 16 April 2002, 19 March 2003 and 12 July 2013. It was registered with the Charity Commission as a charity on 2 July 2003.

The Posture and Mobility Group is also a registered charity in Scotland, number SCO44218. It was registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) as a charity on 23 August 2013.

Organisational structure

All trustees are all members of the PMG executive committee who determine the general policy of the charity and make the major decisions. The day to day management of the charity is carried out by the PMG Manager, Olwen Ellis.

Risk management

The trustees are aware that in order for the charity to comply with SORP 2005 a review of the major strategic, financial and operational risks which the charity faces needs to be reviewed and addressed. These are reviewed and discussed in both the Finance and Executive committees.

Appointment of trustees

Vested in continuing trustees. There is a requirement of a minimum of three trustees. These are the Chair, Vice-chair, and Treasurer.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

To advance the education of the public in all matters relating to the posture and mobility needs of people with disabilities and about the equipment and services those needs require within a framework which recognises the rights and dignity of such people, through all or any of the following means:

- (i) developing an interdisciplinary forum for continuing education, research and debate in the interests of the general public and of people with disabilities in particular.
- (ii) providing an umbrella organisation linking members of voluntary and statutory agencies, representatives of users' bodies and representatives of manufacturers.
- (iii) maintaining a register of members to enable efficient communication.
- (iv) encouraging the establishment and maintenance of high standards of service delivery.

In the exercise of our powers to that end we have paid due regard to the published guidance from the Charity Commission on the operation of the Public Benefit requirement under the Charities Act 2011.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The membership approved that PMG become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, and an application for the change of status was made to the Charity Commission which was approved post year end.

PMG applied for registration as a charity in Northern Ireland, but there is a long waiting list of applications with local charities being registered first.

As planned, the post of Events & Marketing co-ordinator was created on a one-year contract from February 2014, with the PMG office re-locating to a low-rent space within the Exeter Community Centre in order to house two members of staff.

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

The post of PMG Manager was made permanent from October 2014.

The 2014 National Training Event took place at Motorpoint Arena in Cardiff, realising a substantial surplus which will help progress the group's aims and objectives.

The decision was taken to remove PMG membership fees from 1st January 2015, and to cease publication of the hard copy journal in 2015.

The Education & Training committee worked with the National Wheelchair Managers Forum to scope training provision for those working in the posture and mobility field, and produced a document which is available to download from the PMG website.

Six further Best Practice Guidelines (BPGs) were published on the PMG website:

Pressure Mapping Guidelines
Measurement Guidelines
Elevating Seat Wheelchairs
Empowering in Cognitive Disability - Powered Mobility
Upper Extremity Health
Powered Mobility for Children

bringing the current total to seven BPGs.

Reserves continued to be made available to support the research fund, with one new study being offered funding and another reaching completion during the year. Jo Goodship's findings from the PMG commissioned scoping exercise on service users' views were published.

James Foy produced an in-depth specification for developing the PMG website, which will be put out to tender early in 2015.

Two training days by Sharon Pratt will be hosted in London and Leeds during February 2015, in conjunction with Ottobock. 10 bursaries will be offered.

The PMG Annual Conference will take place at the University of Leeds in July 2015. The book token will be reinstated for the event, to the value of £15. Twenty bursaries will be offered, with 10 being earmarked for final year students.

The PMG website specification will be sent out to tender. The new website will include an on-line journal facility.

A new logo will be created to be launched with the new website.

Membership of PMG will be free of charge from January 2015.

The Treasurer will seek a higher interest bank account for PMG reserves.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources are accounted for on a receivable basis.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in furtherance of the charity's objectives and represents the cost of goods and services and ancillary trading costs that have been incurred in charitable activities. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirement of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

Grants payable are included in the SOFA when they have been authorised by the trustees and the commitment is included in the accounts as a creditor.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

The Research and Development Fund was set up in 2005 to support relevant research and development. Since the project was set up the group have approved research projects totalling £92,391 of which researchers have claimed £67,852. The trustees have taken the decision to take the value of authorised grants to the SOFA each year rather than the actual amount paid out, and any unpaid grants are recorded as a creditor.

As at the balance sheet date the research and development fund had uncommitted funds of £16,228 (2013: £5,326).

The Seed Fund was set up in 2012 and is to be used for any future collaborations between BSRM and PMG. On 10th November 2014 the Finance Committee agreed to transfer the balance of the Seed Fund to the General Funds of PMG.
